The centre has five professors and more than 35 research fellows and Ph.D. students from a range of academic disciplines including History, Political Science, Religious Studies, Anthropology, and Development Economics. The teaching period runs from mid-April to mid-July for the summer semester, and from mid-October to mid-February for the winter semester. Typically, there are no academic events during the semester break and many colleagues are on research trips.

#### Scholarship

The DAAD-funded scholarship covers travel costs of up to €1,075 as well as a monthly stipend of €1,200. The scholarship period should overlap with the semester (i.e. between mid-April and mid-July, or between mid-October and mid-February). The teaching period for which the guest professorship is advertised runs from mid-October 2022 to mid-February 2023.

#### Scholarships

The DAAD-funded scholarships cover travel costs of up to €1,075 as well as a monthly stipend of €2,300. The selected candidates will teach a 56 teaching-hour (45 minutes each) course at the M.A. level, for which they will receive an honorarium of  $\leq$ 40/hour ( $\leq$ 40 x 56 =  $\leq$ 2,240). The candidates will be required to teach during the winter semester (i.e. between mid-October 2022 and mid-February 2023). Assistance in all organizational matters relating to the stay in Göttingen will be provided.
